## FEELING HOT, HOT HOT!

The Jackals went 5-2 on their most recent road trip, including two of three from these Newark Bears last weekend.

New Jersey raised its team batting average to .298, the highest in the Can-Am League. They are batting .360 over their last ten games as a collective.

Leading the way is former Major Leaguer Angel Berroa, who is 14-26 since coming off the disabled list.

Kyle Greenwalt gets the call today for New Jersey. His most recent win came against these Bears, when he went six innings allowing three runs on five hits.



## JACKALS SOAR OVER TORNADOES

The Jackals took three out of four from the Worcester Tornadoes earlier this week, pushing their record to 42-29. They are currently three games back of first-place Quebec.

New Jersey outscored Worcester 37-16 in the four-game set. Former Tornado Nick Salotti went 10-19 with two home runs and six RBIs in the series.

In game one, the Jackals scored a season high 18 runs off 21 hits, highlighted by Nick Giarraputo's grand slam and Angel Berroa's 4-4, 3 BB day.

Cam Kneeland's walk-off home run in game 2 gave Worcester their only win of the series. Dustin Birosak and Isaac Pavlik led the way in the two most recent wins.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

The Jackals are 9-5 against Newark this season, including taking two of three last weekend.

Angel Berroa currently has a 12-game hit streak, reaching base in 19 of his last 23 plate appearances. Gaetano Giunta extended his hit streak to 11 yesterday, going 1-5 on the day.

Jackals' pitching has struck out at least one batter in 19 straight innings.

## PAVLIK'S RECORD BREAKING SEASON

After adding Can-Am and Jackals all-time strikeout leader to his resume earlier this season, Isaac Pavlik made history once more when he broke the Jackals' all-time win record by recording his 60th win on July 2nd in Newark. Pavlik had previously been tied with Joel Bennett for first all-time with 59 wins.

His two strikeouts in his start on June 8th against the Quebec Capitales give him 637 for his career, eclipsing Joel Bennett's 632 from 2001-07.

Pavlik also tied Bennett's all-time complete game record earlier this season. He now has 15 for his career.



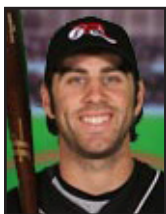

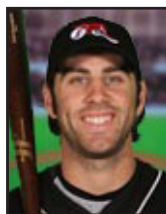

## NEW JERSEY SEASON IN REVIEW

In their 15th anniversary season, the Jackals' bats have continued to dominate. Nick Giarraputo, June's Player of the Month, headlines the list of Jackals hitters with strong seasons. New Jersey leads the Can-Am League in home runs (77) and batting average (.289).

On the mound, Isaac Pavlik has returned for his eighth season with the club and is now the Jackals all-time strike-out king with 651. On July 2nd, he broke Joel Bennett's all-time wins record in franchise history with 60. Steve Fox is second in the Can-Am League in wins with eight.

The Jackals are 37-27, six-and-a-half games back of the Quebec Capitales.

## CUSICK POWERS HIS WAY TO HITTER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Jackals' second baseman Matt Cusick has been named this week's Hitter of the Week. Cusick's 9-21 week at the plate included a home run, two triples, and nine runs scored. His two-run home run yesterday against the Bears tied the ballgame at three.

His two triples came in the same game, tying a Can-Am record. The New Jersey Jackals now have a league-high eight players with the 2012 honor.

The Mission Viejo, CA native came over from the Fargo-Moorhead Redhawks on June 8th in exchange for pitcher Mike Zenko and a player to be named later. In 40 games since coming over, Cusick has hit to a .333 average, five home runs, and 20 RBIs.
